Tema Central	Conceptos para Estudiar	
<b>1.- Present continuous in affirmative and negative form.</b>	We use this tense to talk about things happening at the moment.	Example: <i>We are working so hard.</i> <i>I am not reading a book.</i>
<b>2.- Verb be in Simple past in affirmative and negative form.</b>	We use this tense to describe situations, places and people in the past.	Example: <i>I was sick yesterday.</i> <i>We weren't at home last week.</i>
<b>3.- There was/There were.</b>	We use them to talk about things that existed or were present in the past. It could be singular or plural nouns.	Example: <i>There was a pen on the table.</i> <i>There were three bottles on the desk.</i>
<b>4.- Simple past of regular and irregular verbs in affirmative form.</b>	We use this tense to describe situations, places and people in the past.	Example: <i>I started a new project.</i> <i>She drank an orange juice.</i>
<b>5.- Simple past of regular and irregular verbs in negative and interrogative form.</b>	We use the auxiliar <i>did</i> to form negative sentences and questions in simple past.	Example: <i>We didn't go to the concert.</i> <i>Did you finish your homework?</i>
<b>5.- Comparison: as...as</b>	We use the comparison to say that two things, people or places are the same in some way.	Example: <i>Cancun is as hot as Acapulco.</i> <i>Monterrey is not as populated as Mexico City.</i>
