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Tema Central	Conceptos para Estudiar	
Would	We use <i>would</i> for requests, offers, invitations and wishes.	Example: - <i>Would</i> you like some coffee? Yes, I <i>would</i> . -I <i>would like</i> to go to Europe.
Present continuous	We use this tense to mention that an action is happening right now. Also, it is used for future arrangements.	Example: -My sister <i>is working</i> on a project. -My father <i>is having</i> a business trip next month.
Regular and Irregular verbs.	-The <i>regular verbs</i> end in 'ed' in past and past participle. -The <i>irregular verbs</i> often change in past and past participle.	Example: -Regular verbs: want, wanted, wanted. -Irregular verbs: Do, did, done.
Present perfect	This tense is used to express actions that occurred in an indefinite time before the present. Also, it is important and it continues in the present.	Example: -I <i>have brought</i> my lunch. -She <i>has driven</i> a car. <i>Have</i> : I, you, we and they. <i>Has</i> : He, she and it.
Present perfect (since/for)	We use <i>since</i> : to indicate the specific moment when something started. We use <i>for</i> : to indicate the period of time of something.	There are some examples to use <i>since</i> and <i>for</i> . <i>Since</i> : Last Christmas, February, 2015, I was a child and Monday. <i>For</i> : many years, 6 months, a long time, ten minutes and 3 weeks.
